As the days get hotter and hotter, sometimes it's just not possible to do everything you'd hoped to do in your garden. But it's not a total no-go zone. You can give your garden beds a quick refresh with a layer of mulch, potted colour by doorways or flowering plants in garden beds and freshly trimmed lawn edges. Mow your lawn as high as your lawnmower allows you. When the days are hot, try to position your pot plants in the shade or shelter them from the hot western sun. Water during the cooler parts of the day, The morning is best. It's common to experience water restrictions during the hotter months in Australia, so if you're limited by how much you can water, aim to water your plants deeply. *Courtesy of Better Homes and Gardens*
